

## Legal Rights

Your Legal Rights are protected under the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms:

<http://laws.justice.gc.ca/en/charter/>

The Youth Criminal Justice Act also offers further protections for youth, by ensuring they understand what is happening at each stage in the process, that they are informed of their rights at each stage, and that they have access to legal assistance (i.e. a Lawyer or Counsel), and to a parent or other adult they know, at each stage in the process.

## Suggested Activities

- Have groups of students rewrite sections of the charter in their own words. These descriptions may also be accompanied by illustrations or examples.
- Have students create skits acting out a situation where a person is exercising their rights. They may then compare their understanding to the explanations provided at the Government of Canada Canadian Heritage website:
